about the monroe mustangs



The Monroe College Athletic Department fields teams in twelve sports: baseball, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's soccer, softball, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and women's volleyball. All Monroe teams are members of the National Junior College Athletic Association and participate in NJCAA Region XV. Monroe Mustangs men's basketball and baseball are Division I programs. All of the other Monroe sports play in Division III.

MEN'S BASKETBALL: Monroe College Mustang men's basketball is firmly established as an NJCAA powerhouse. Since the 1991-92 season, the Mustangs have a remarkable .710 winning percentage. In 2002-03, the Mustangs turned on the nation with a high-flying fifth-place finish in the NJCAA, Division I national tournament. They won four straight Region XV championships and appeared in four straight District III finals, winning the Title in 2005-06 and again advancing to the Nationals, where they finished eighth. Monroe basketball alumni have gone on to star in European professional basketball and the NCAA Division I at a number of colleges including the University of Houston, Iowa State, St. John's, University of Utah, St. Peter's, Cornell, and LIU. In 2004-05 two Monroe players were recognized as Academic All-Americans.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL: Established as a varsity sport in 1998, the Lady Mustangs are the defending national champions and have won two of the last three titles. They are also on a streak of five consecutive Region XV Championships, a 46-game home winning streak and incredible 103-game conference winning streak. Last year's championship season featured a 31-2 record. In 2005-06 they were the NJCAA, Division III National Champions, concluding a remarkable 36-0 season, the only undefeated team in the nation. In 2003-04 the Lady Mustangs were 24-9 Region XV champions advancing all the way to seventh-place in the NJCAA national tournament. In 2004-05 they were even better, winning the Region title again and becoming NJCAA Finalists. The winning percentage for the Lady Mustangs since 2001 is .801. The Lady Mustangs are winners in the classroom, too, and in 2004-05 the Lady Mustangs were named as an NJCAA Academic All-American team and two players were honored as Academic All-Americans.

MEN'S SOCCER: Consistency is the name of the game for Monroe College men's soccer. Since 1999, the Mustangs have been winners year in and year out, including two appearances in the Regional Championship game. Traditionally, an emphasis on teamwork on the Mustangs soccer team breeds a family-type atmosphere that means success both on and off the field.

WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL: Monroe College women's volleyball is getting better each year. Having had a few years of the normal growing pains associated with a new program, three years ago the Lady Mustangs made the playoffs for the first time. Then in 2004 they finished 21-4 and played all the way to the Region XV Championship game. In 2005 and again in 2006 they were Region XV playoff teams. The coach's enthusiasm, combined with a talented group of recruits each year, is turning this budding program into a powerhouse.

SOFTBALL: In its first year of varsity play in 2004, the Lady Mustangs were more than respectable. They finished 10-9, won the important games down the stretch of the season, and clinched a playoff spot. With that first season under their belts, Monroe went on to make the Region Championship game in just their second year of varsity play. They repeated as region finalists in 2006 and with a new head coach in 2007, they again made the playoffs, advancing to the semi-final round. In 2008 they were Region XV finalists.

BASEBALL: 2005 was the first varsity season for Mustang baseball. Since then the team has established itself. In 2006, they played in the playoffs in just their second season and in 2007 they went the next step, advancing to the first round of the Region XV playoffs. 2008 was a turning point as they finished third in the Regional tournament, their first season as a Division I team. Baseball players have graduated from Monroe and played in Division I and II, as well as the ACBL, an elite summer league. So with an outreach effort into the Caribbean, and an unwavering dedication to bringing aboard the best local talent, things are looking up for Monroe College baseball!

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY AND INDOOR AND OUTDOOR TRACK AND FIELD: The Monroe College track and field teams made their debut in the Fall, 2007. The Mustangs track program will field six teams: men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track and field, and men's and women's outdoor track and field. To build the track and field program, the Monroe Athletics Department will apply the same principles for success that have made the Mustangs winners in other sports: quality coaching, aggressive recruiting, and high standards of performance.

Monroe College was founded in 1933 with a single goal: To educate men and women for a successful future. Monroe offers Graduate, Bachelor's and Associate Degree programs in the most relevant areas for today's rapidly changing global economy.

DEGREES OFFERED

Monroe offers Master's (M.B.A.), Bachelor's (B.B.A., B.S.), and Associate (A.A.S., A.S.) degrees leading to employment in today's largest fields.

The Master's Degree program in Business Management is offered at the King Graduate School of Business.

The Bachelor's Degree programs are in Accounting, Business Management, Criminal Justice, General Business, Health Services Administration, Hospitality Management, Information Technology and Public Health.

Monroe's Associate Degree programs are in Accounting and Finance, Business Administration, Baking and Pastry Arts, Criminal Justice, Culinary Arts, Hospitality Management, Information Technology, Medical Administration, Medical Assisting, Nursing (RN) and Pharmacy Technician.

There is also a continuing education program and a certificate program in Practical Nursing.

CAMPUSES

The six buildings and Annex that comprise the Monroe College **Bronx campus** are located in the Fordham section of the Bronx at Fordham Road and Jerome Avenue. The Bronx campus provides students with a wide array of educational experiences within a distinctly urban setting. A major advantage of the location is its proximity to New York City's major resources and attractions.

The **New Rochelle campus** is on Main Street. Located in downtown New Rochelle, this campus has the advantage of being in a suburban community. Monroe students can live on campus or commute to school. In 2003, Milavec Hall, a state-of-the-art classroom and administration building, was added. A year later, Allison Hall, a 200-bed dormitory was opened, and in October 2006 a state-of-the-art Culinary Arts Center was opened right in the center of the New Rochelle campus.

The scenic **St. Lucia campus** in Barnard Hill Castries on the Caribbean island of St. Lucia combines the best of many worlds. With a spectacular view on a hill that overlooks the ocean, the St. Lucia campus provides a serene setting just minutes away from the bustle of the city of Castries. The blend of faculty that hails both from St. Lucia and New York teaches Bachelor's Degree programs in Business Management, Criminal Justice and Hospitality, as well as MBA courses.

JEFFREY S. BRUSTAD HEAD COACH

Now in his seventh year, Coach Brustad has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in the NY Metro Area. Coach Brustad has an incredible .795 winning percentage at Monroe. In 2005-06, Monroe won more games than any Mustang men's team had ever won before. They were 33-5, won their second District III title, fourth Region XV championship, and made their second appearance in the NJCAA Division I National Tournament. Monroe made its first National Tournament appearance under Coach Brustad in 2002-03 after posting a stellar 31-3 record. The formula for Brustad's success has become clear. Recruit skilled, athletic players, plug them into a system that lets them maximize their talents within a team framework, and motivate them to outwork opponents on both ends of the floor. As a result, the Mustangs win and provide wondrous entertainment for Mustangs fans. Prior to being named head coach, Coach Brustad was a Monroe assistant for seven years. He also coached in other colleges and at the high school level. In 1992 he was an assistant at Cazenovia College and the next two seasons he assisted at Sullivan County Community College, where he coached in two NJCAA National Championship Finals, winning it all in 1994. A 1990 graduate of the State University of Oneonta, Coach Brustad received a Bachelor's Degree in Education and Mathematics. In June of 2000, he earned his MS degree in Recreation Education from Lehman College.



BROCK ERICKSON ASSISTANT COACH

Now in his second season with the Mustangs, it's clear that Coach Erickson knows basketball. From the time he was the captain of the Winchendon Prep School team that won the school's first ever NEPSAC Class A championship, he's been a player or coach on winning teams. Erickson played two years for current Boston College coach Al Skinner on the University of Rhode Island team that boasted of current LA Clipper star Cuttino Mobley. He was an assistant coach at CCNY from 2002-2004. The 2003 CCNY team won more games than any in the school's history since 1950, along the way winning the CUNYAC championship and advancing to the NCAA tournament. From 2004-2006 he was the assistant at the College of Eastern Utah team that won more games than the school had in ten years. There were seven all-conference players and one All-American on those Eastern Utah teams. Erickson received his Bachelor's degree in Business Communications from Assumption College.



ALLEN JENKINS ASSISTANT COACH

Now in his sixth season as a Monroe assistant, it's clear that winning basketball teams follow Allen Jenkins around. He was the starting point guard on one of the greatest teams in Monroe college history, the legendary 1997-98 Mustangs that went 31-3 and played in the NJCAA finals. In his junior year, Coach Jenkins led the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown to its best-ever record and highest-ever national ranking. Always fundamentally sound, that year he finished seventh in Division II in steals. As a college senior he led Alderson-Broadus to its first-ever conference tournament finals. Prior to coaching at Monroe he was an assistant coach at Alderson-Broadus. Coach Jenkins graduated from Peekskill HS, and received an AAS degree from Monroe in Business and a BS degree from Alderson-Broadus in Marketing. In addition to his coaching duties, he's a counselor in the Monroe College Bursar's office.



DANA WARNER ASSISTANT COACH

Dana Warner knows a lot about what it takes to play big in big games. A star player for Monroe from 1998-2000, Coach Warner improved as a player in each of his collegiate seasons. As a sophomore he averaged a solid 13.7 ppg for the Mustangs' first-ever Division I team that went 22-10 and won a Region Championship. He concluded his playing days on high notes, to say the least, as a First-team CUNY All-star averaging 18 ppg and 6 apg for a CCNY team that won the CUNY Championship. He was the MVP of the CUNY tournament, a Met Basketball Writers First-team All-star, and a Third-team All-Atlantic Region selection. He then coached at CCNY for a year and eventually continued his playing career overseas. But he's now back home to Monroe, where it all started, to share his basketball knowledge and big-game experience.





3 JAMELL CROMARTIE

6' 0" - 185 lbs. - Guard - Sophomore
 High School: White Plains
 Hometown: White Plains, NY
 Major: Business Administration

In his freshman year, Jamell played an important role for Monroe. Relying on basketball smarts and a variety of court skills, in his 13 starts, Jamell was a settling influence on offense, a real go-to guy who got the ball to the open man, and also a solid shut-'em-down defender. A true point guard who sees the floor well, in 2007-08 Jamell knocked down the trey with regularity, shooting 29% from the arc. Also, he averaged 8.1 ppg, 2.8 apg, and was the Mustangs' best free-throw shooter at 81.3%. *As a four-year varsity player in high school, Jamell averaged 15 ppg, 5 apg, and 3.8 spg. He also led his conference in three-point shooting. His resume includes second-team All-county, and a place on the fifth All-state team.*



4 JOSEPH DAVIS

6' 4" - 215 lbs. - Forward - Freshman
 High School: Peekskill HS
 Hometown: Peekskill, NY
 Major: Business Administration

The bottom line on any winning team over a long season is depth. Joseph is a quality inside/outside-type guard who understands his role on a team that's flush with talented guards. For sure, he can shoot, but most important, he knows there's no "I" in team. Want proof? Watch him move without the ball! *Dogged by injuries, Joseph saw limited action in his senior year of high school. But he was part of a winning team in his two varsity years, averaging 7 ppg and 4 rpg in his junior year.*



5 KYLE WRIGHT

6' 5" - 215 lbs. - Guard - Sophomore
 Transfer: SUNY Stony Brook, University of Colorado
 High School: Brewster Academy
 Hometown: Hartford, CT
 Major: Business Administration

Does the term "impact player" mean anything to you? For starters, on a team filled with outside shooters, Kyle could be the best of them. Also, this big, versatile, talented athlete can play the point. And he can play the two. And oh, yes, he can play the three. And he can play all of them well. No wonder Providence got his commitment even before he laced up for Monroe. *The nation's second leading scorer in high school, Kyle was ranked as the number-four player in the nation.*



TYVON WILLIAMS 10

6' 0" - 170 lbs. - Guard - Sophomore
 High School: St. Thomas More Prep
 Hometown: Manhattan, NY
 Major: Business Administration

Throughout his freshman season, the "wows" from Monroe fans were audible every time Tyvon took the floor. With a devastating first step that left defenders dazed and confused, Tyvon showed he could drive to – and above – the rim with authority. But his court skills went beyond that. Ty was second on the team in scoring at 12.3 ppg, a solid three-ball shooter at 30.8%, a 74% free-throw shooter, and led the team in assists with 3.8 apg. He was one of three Mustangs to play in all of the team's 32 games, starting 19 of them. *At Our Savior New American School, Tyvon averaged 19 ppg and an impressive 8 apg. He then played at St. Thomas More in the NEPSAC Class A league. Tyvon has signed a letter of intent to attend South Carolina State next season.*



MICHAEL TUIT 11

6' 2" - 175 lbs. - Guard - Freshman
 High School: American Christian
 Hometown: Bronx, NY
 Major: Business Administration

It's a good guess that Michael is a good card player because on the court, his shifty ways and crafty ball-handling skills are obvious strengths. A solid point guard with a good court awareness and knowledge of the game, Michael can pass and drive, and like any smart gambler, he'll keep opponents guessing as to what's coming next! *Michael had impressive high school numbers: 15 ppg, 5.2 rpg and a whopping 8.1 apg.*



TERRIC HARRIS 13

6' 5" - 245 lbs. - Forward - Freshman

By the end of this season Monroe fans will know Terric as "The Enforcer." A physical presence, opponents will not only think twice about charging into the paint, but they are also going to have a heckuva time getting rebounds – on either end of the court. Along with Freddy Obame, Terric is going to provide intimidation on the interior. *In high school Terric averaged a solid 10 ppg and 8 rpg.*



21 CHARLES FUNCHES

6' 8" - 200 lbs. - Forward- Sophomore

High School: University Charter

Transfer: Paris Community College

Hometown: Bayonne, NJ

Major: Business Administration

Opponents will look at Charles' size and immediately make judgments about the type of player he is: tall with an inside game. But if they do, they'll get torched, not only on the inside where he can move and score, but also on the outside where he can jump and shoot. He also plays D. Even before the season, Coach Brustad projected Charles to be a starter and said this: "He can play!"

In high school Charles was an All-County and All-Region player, averaging 22 ppg, 11 rpg, and 2 bpg.



23 RANDY DEZOUVRE

6' 4" - 190 lbs. - Guard/Forward - Freshman

Major: Business Administration

Rev it up, Randy! And if the game is on, Randy's energy is on. A tenacious defender and rebounder, Randy makes teammates better by example. Move without the ball, move with the ball, and keep moving anytime he's on the court. Also, Randy will bring toughness to the floor. Monroe fans, Revvin' Randy is high motor activity!

Randy was impressive in high school averaging 15.5 ppg and 10.1 rpg. He also was named an All Canadian First-Team All-Star, was Athlete of the Year, and a CCAA first team all-star. At the nationals he won a bronze medal for his 22.3 ppg and 1-0.1 rpg.



30 WESTLY PERRYMAN

6' 2" - 180 lbs. - Guard - Sophomore

High School: East Boston

Hometown: Boston, MA

Major: Business Administration

Simply put, Westly was Monroe's best player in 2007-08. In fact, he was the team leader in ten statistical categories. A third team NJCAA All-American, Westly was Co-MVP of Region XV, and a First-Team Region Tournament All-star. He was also invited to Jerry Mullen's prestigious Top 100 Junior College Camp. Boise State is going to be very happy with their new guard next year because Westly can do it all. Backed by a solid work ethic that fuels his ferocious on-court energy, Westly's repertoire includes the quickest moves of any player on the court, an uncanny instinct for the game of basketball, through-the-roof leaping abilities, and a deadeye jumper from literally any spot on the court. Westly's high school numbers, 20 ppg, 6 apg, 6 rpg, only tell the beginning of the story. He was ranked Massachusetts #1 guard, he was All-State in his senior year, an All-Scholastic player, a three year All-Star, named to the Boston Herald Dream Team, and was team captain and MVP.

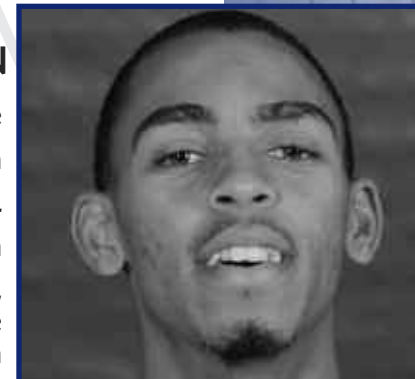

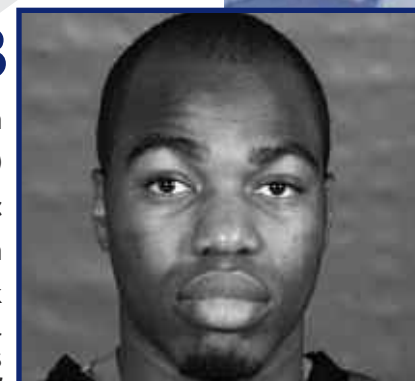

2007-08 men's basketball season in review

This was a season that continued the Mustangs' remarkable success under Coach Jeff Brustad. Along with an impressive record of 24-8, making it the sixth year in a row the team won more than 20 games, Monroe finished the regular season tied for first place in the Region. In addition, Coach Brustad was able to lay the foundation for the future by establishing young players who should keep the team at its peak.

For example, Monroe got an eyeful of a solid oak named Freddy Obarne in the Region title game. Freddy played his best game at the season's penultimate moment, with 10/14 shooting leading to 23 points and 10 rebounds, including six offensive boards.

Also, of course, all year long Monroe fed off All-American Westly Perryman. Westly was the Co-MVP in Region XV and earned his honors by leading the team with 15.3 ppg and 4.4 rpg and eight other statistical categories. He also knocked down 34.7% of his treys, including an incredible one at the buzzer that propelled Monroe to maybe its most thrilling win, an overtime nail-biter against Harcum at the end of January.

In 2007-08 Monroe also established depth at the guard position that will be a Rock of Gibraltar this season. Tyvon Williams (12.3 ppg and 3.8 apg) had numerous flashes of brilliance and Jamell Cromartie (8.1 ppg and 2.9 apg) showed he can shake up opponents on defense and provide consistent sparks on offense.

But, maybe most the important Mustang stats of all came off the court and in the classroom, where Monroe players excelled, finishing with a team GPA of over 3.0 in both the Fall and Winter semesters. Obarne led the way with a 3.94, N'faly Berete posted a 3.54, and Herman Wrice had a 3.4.

This excellence defined the entire men's basketball program in 2007-08 as all the sophomores graduated and moved on to four-year schools.

So while fans chanted out the spelling of MO-NR-OE, when it came to Mustangs basketball in 2007-08, they might instead have spelled SU-CC-ESS!

THE COACHES

SETH GOODMAN HEAD COACH

Now in his eighth season at Monroe, Seth Goodman has transformed the Lady Mustangs into one of the nation's most successful basketball teams at any level. Since assuming the reins in 2001-02, Goodman has an incredible 180-35 (.837) record. In 2007-08 Goodman's Lady Mustangs won their second NJCAA, Division III National Championship in three years and their fifth consecutive Region XV championship and national tournament appearance. In 2006-07, they were 33-3 and finished third in the national tournament. The 2005-06 Lady Mustangs will go down as one of the greatest basketball teams in the history of the NJCAA. Coach Goodman's Lady Mustangs were 36-0 on the way to winning the national final game by a whopping 30 points. For his efforts, Coach Goodman was named WBCA Coach of the Year. Leading up to the 2008 Summer Olympics, Coach Goodman was selected as a court coach for the 2008 USA Basketball Women's U18 National Team Trials. Coach Goodman was an assistant coach at Mt. St. Vincent. He has also been a co-director and coach of Hoop Street Gang, a non-profit organization whose goal is to help high school boys move to the next level. Coach Goodman is a graduate of Adelphi University where he won a national championship in 1995, was national runner-up in 1996 and earned a degree in sports management and an M.A. in Education. Coach Goodman is the coordinator of Monroe College High School Programs. He resides with his wife Fatimah, in Stanford CT.



JAMES ROBINSON, JR ASSISTANT COACH

In his 25 years of coaching experience Coach Robinson has proven that he has the ability to handle the challenges and demands of coaching basketball at all levels. He's also expert in the fundamentals, a keen evaluator of student/athlete talent, and the kind of pro who can handle the recruiting process to maximum benefit for the student/athletes and the team. Since 1994, Coach Robinson has been the basketball trainer for the Department of Parks & Recreation in Peekskill, New York where he coordinated basketball leagues and trained and mentored young athletes. As Assistant Coach at Peekskill HS in 2006, he was an effective communicator between the players and head coach. In short, Coach Robinson is the perfect assistant coach for the Lady Mustangs: he knows how to provide the support systems necessary for a winning basketball program.



TELISHA MOULTRE ASSISTANT COACH

Coach Moultre is the first of Coach Goodman's former players to serve as an assistant and he's excited about having someone who knows his systems and is a natural leader on and off the court. As a starter on the 2004-05 team that made the National Finals, Moultre was selected as an Honorable Mention All-Region player. Known as a hard-nosed competitor, Moultre is currently ninth on the all-time Lady Mustang scoring list with 493 points. Because the large majority of those points came in the paint, it makes sense that Moultre will be important to Coach Goodman's efforts in improving front court play. Her ability to relate with players will also be an asset. After Monroe she attended Post University, where she was named as a Second-Team All-Conference player.

From either guard position, she can penetrate amongst the trees for a bucket, create for teammates, or even stick an occasional 'J' to keep everyone honest. She also plays good defense.
In her freshman season, Shakeena averaged 5.9 ppg, 3.4 rpg, 2.6 apg, and 2.2 spg.

2007-08 women's basketball season in review

Coming off a disappointing Final Four defeat in the National Tournament the year before, the goal for the 2007-08 Lady Mustangs was to win the National Championship. Nothing less would suffice.

Blessed with an eventual All-American, the splendid Monet Johnson; veteran leadership at the guards with classic point guard Tierra Cleaves and tenacious Tiana Gilliam; and the quiet fire of Center Veree Harris; it appeared that all the pieces were in place for a title run.

Monroe opened the season 10-0 before they were really tested during the traditionally difficult holiday swing through Florida. In Palm Beach they beat a tough Black Hawk East team for their 11th straight, but then met their match for their first loss of the season against Wallace State. They rebounded to beat Palm Beach CC handily and since all three of those were Division I teams, the tough trip had to be considered a success.

The only other loss came to a DII team, CCRI. But outside of that, right through the National Finals, the Lady Mustangs ran the table.

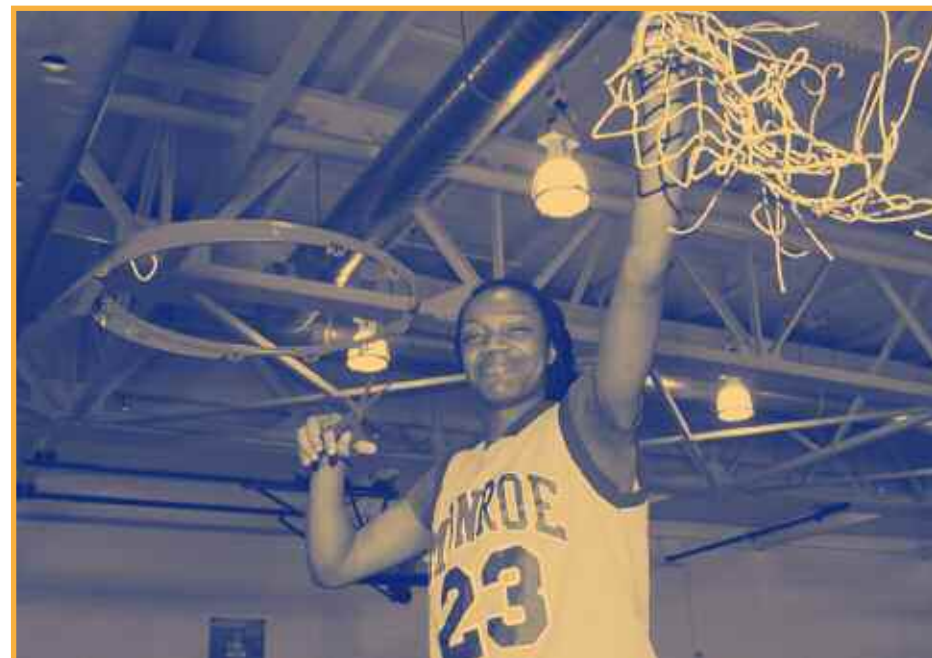
And run they did! By the time their fifth straight Region XV Championship was safely secured, the Lady Mustangs had amassed an all-time record of 46 consecutive home wins and a 103-game conference winning streak.

In Utica for the National Tournament, the Lady Mustangs made quick work of Holyoke in the quarter finals, winning by 50. In the semis, some unkind statements in the papers from the Brookdale coach fired up the Lady Mustangs and they went on to a tough-fought, but definitive, 20-point win.

The task in the finals was made more difficult not only by having to face Mohawk Valley in front of their raucous home fans, but oppressively close foul calling. And when Cleaves went down with an injury early in the game, Monroe could have folded.

But Monet Johnson took control of the game with 20 points in the second half and gave a clinic on how an All-American approaches crunch time en route to a 30-point, 14-rebound, title-sealing performance.

But others also played big: Gilliam with 12 points and 7 steals, and Talaya Robinson popping a couple of game-turning treys to help give Monroe a 31-point win and their second National Championship in three years.


