## Accelerated Second Degree Option

The Monroe College B.S. in Nursing Accelerated Second Degree Option is designed for adults who are seeking a change in career and have already earned a bachelor's degree. The program allows students to focus on core nursing classes.

### Admission Requirements

- Online application, including a personal statement of 350–500 words
- High school diploma or GED
- All high school and college transcripts
- TEAS exam score at the proficient level with a 70 or higher
- Proof that you have completed prerequisite courses with a letter grade of “C+” or better in Algebra, Biology/Living Environment, and Chemistry
- Bachelor's degree with a GPA of 3.0 or higher preferred

### Information Sessions

We answer questions concerning admissions requirements, prerequisites, taking the TEAS, transfer credits, and the steps involved in applying. Our information sessions are designed to give you a chance to have all of your questions answered and learn a bit more about a typical day in the life of a Monroe Nursing student.

### Application Process

An admissions advisor will guide each applicant through the required steps:

1. Attend a Nursing Information Session
2. Register and take the TEAS Exam
3. Make an appointment and meet with an admissions advisor
4. Submit the required documents
5. Receive notice of admission from the School of Nursing
6. Complete Financial Aid
7. Complete a background check
8. Complete a physical examination
9. Register for classes
