SHORT-TERM CUSTOMIZED TRAINING WORKSHOPS

The programming available through Monroe's School of Criminal and Social Justice is designed to reflect the specific needs of local police and the unique communities they serve.

Our faculty have extensive "real world" policing experience, with many having served in the senior ranks of the New York Police Department and as instructors and curriculum-builders within its police academy.

Workshop content and length would be determined in consultation with the sponsoring country or agency, delivered on-site, online, or a combination of both.

- Fundamentals in human rights

DEGREE PROGRAMS

In addition to short-term workforce training programs, Monroe also partners with Caribbean countries and their police agencies to provide opportunities for police professionals to pursue college degrees at both the undergraduate and graduate level.

We offer Associate, Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Criminal Justice, as well as undergraduate degrees in Human Services.

Classes may be taken online or at our campuses in New York (Bronx or New Rochelle); some degree programs are also offered at our St. Lucia campus. We also offer the opportunity for students to pursue their degrees online with two-, four-, and 15-week in-person sessions in the final semester in New York.
