Teachers complete certifications in both childhood education (grades 1-6) and special education (grades 1-6) over the course of 15 transformative months.

The program, aligned with NYSED's Culturally Responsive-Sustaining Education Framework, is designed around the developmental needs of elementary children in urban environments, with a focus on serving all learners including those who are culturally and linguistically diverse and those with disabilities. Expert faculty guide teachers in best practices for inclusion and individualized instruction.Flexible full-time and part-time options allow working educators to complete coursework in hybrid and fully online models.

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This 33-credit dual certificate graduate program combines hybrid and online courses over 4 semesters of full-time study, or students may choose to study part-time. It is **intended to support the professional growth of initially licensed teachers** and continue their development as high performing, skilled, and passionate educator- practitioners.

This Master of Arts in Teaching degree is a 33-credit program consisting of 8 core courses (24 credits) plus 3 general education courses in math and language/literacy specific to childhood education (9 credits).
